Answer 1

Literally, the definition of success is the achievement of set goals or targets, set by you or set by others. No-one would disagree with that definition. Disagreements about what success means arise because we disagree about what the goals or targets should be. A lot of people are critical, in theory at least, of those who make earning money their goal. But I think that is unfair, because their underlying goal is financial security for themselves and their families, which is a perfectly legitimate aim. The problem, as I see it, is that many people do not adjust their goals as circumstances change. Someone who started out by making money the measure of their success will inevitably, at some point in their life – when they find they have no time for family or friends or when they become sick from stress and overwork – question this: 'Why did I define success as having a lot of money? It hasn't made me happy.' So a better definition of success would be: the understanding of what the correct goals are for you and the achievement of these goals.

Answer 2

When we think of success we generally think of fame, wealth and power - all the obvious things that make other people notice us and think we are important. Being admired by others is a great boost to our self-confidence; it tells us that we have value. Fame, wealth and power are all recognition of our worth to other people, but they are a shallow kind of recognition, a definition of success that society has created. The definition I think is the true one is the recognition from other people that you have helped them or inspired them in some way. So for me, success is being a good human being: being kind to other people, helping people in difficulty, showing love where people lack love and putting people on the right course when they have gone astray.

Answer 3

Before she started raising a family, my mother was a successful athlete. She represented her country in the triathlon many times and won two bronze medals at international events. Then she became pregnant with me and has since had two other children. She gave up her athletics career to focus on raising a family. Does that mean that she achieved success in the past, but is not successful now? I asked her these two questions: did you feel fulfilled as an athlete and that the effort you put in empowered you and rewarded you? Do you feel empowered, fulfilled and rewarded as a mother? The answers she gave me tell you all you need to know about success. She was encouraged to do athletics as a teenager, and although she liked competing, she disliked the training and the travelling to events, which took over her life. Now, she says, she loves her life. She has three healthy children, good friends and neighbours, a lovely home and a garden where she grows plants and vegetables.
