

Saving the password for the class page

iOS

- go to passwords & accounts > website & app passwords
- sign in with your phone password (or fingerprint or face ID) to see the saved passwords
- if you have many, search for “IR”
- ensure the username & password are correct.
- if not, tap edit to allow you to alter them
- if the item is not there, tap + at the top of the screen and add the detail manually.
- When you go to the page the sign-in form will pop up; tap in the username field; the keyboard appears; at the top of the keyboard a key icon and “Passwords” appear; tap that and choose iCloud Keychain (this may not appear if you have no other password apps); sign in to see saved passwords; if necessary search “IR” to find the item; tap on it; the form will be filled in and you can tap enter then the page should appear.
- If you have a password management app it may be easier to use that. RoboForm is a good one, and works across different operating systems. Keeping different passwords for every site you visit is good practice, and a management app makes it easy to sign in.

Android

Seems simple: tap “Save” when it asks you if you want to save the password. After that it should log in without showing the sign-in dbox.

Please let me know if this does not happen, but first try the following:

In Chrome tap the 3 vertical dots at the top right of the screen; choose settings > passwords; check that save passwords is on and auto sign-in is ticked.
