I was just thinking that! / I was just going to say that! / That's just what I was thinking. / I couldn't agree more. / You're totally right.</p> <p style="text-align: center;">Disagreeing (with reasons)</p> <p>Maybe, but what about...? I think it would be better to... .Yeah, but, the thing is... The problem with what you said is...</p>	<p>Well, I think it's definitely not <i>(topic)</i>. We can eliminate <i>(topic)</i> right away. Don't you think? So then, what do you think is the best one? Are we both in favour of <i>(topic)</i>? Okay, so we agree. I don't think we're going to agree on this. Let's agree to disagree.</p>
