The examiner will ask you one or two questions about yourself and what you think about everyday topics such as work or study, travel, holidays, daily life and routines.

- Is there something you'd like to be really good at? (Why?)
- What would you like to be doing in two years' time? (Why?)
- Apart from English, is there a language you'd like to learn? (Why / Why not?)

Part 2 (4 minutes)

Turn to the pictures on page 185, which show people studying in different situations.

PEOPLE STUDYING

Candidate A, I'd like you to compare **two** of the pictures, and say **why the people might** have chosen to study in these different places and how important it might be for them to be able to concentrate on their studies.

Candidate B, who do you think feels that it's important to study well? (Why?)

ENTERTAINING OTHERS

Turn to the pictures on page 186, which show people entertaining others.

Candidate B, compare two of the pictures and say how easy it might be to entertain others in these situations, and how important it might be to perform well.

Candidate A, who do you think has the most difficult task? (Why?)

Part 3 (4 minutes)

Turn to the diagram on page 187, which shows ways in which the media affects our lives.

Now, talk to each other about the benefits and drawbacks of the ways in which the media affects our lives.

Now decide which impact of the media is the most beneficial for everyone.

Part 4 (5 minutes)

Answer these questions.

- In your opinion, what's the best way to find out about the news television, newspapers or the internet? (Why?)
- Some people say the media tends to focus on bad news. Why is this?
- Do you think celebrities should be associated with the advertising of any products or brands? (Why / Why not?)
- What changes would you like to see take place in the media? (Why?)
- Do you think that people have lost the ability to entertain themselves because
 of the availability of the media? (Why / Why not?)
- Do you think people trust the media more or less than in the past? (Why?)

- Why might the people have chosen to study in these different places?
- How important might it be for them to be able to concentrate on their studies?


